Nearly 50% of U.S. inmates have mental health conditions but only 34% of state prison inmates had professional mental health therapy after being admitted to prison; the number is even lower for those in local jails, just 18%.

The United States has the largest prison population in the whole world with more than 2.3 million people behind bars. That's more than the population of New Mexico.

Incarceration has replaced hospitalization for thousands of people with serious mental illness in the United States. State prisons and county jails hold 10 times the number of mentally ill than state psychiatric hospitals.

Vermont has the best access to #MentalHealth care, yet 43% of Vermont adults with mental illness did not receive treatment.

Less access to #MentalHealth care means more incarceration. Ark., Miss. and Ala. have the least access and the most prisoners.

#MentalHealth workforce shortage: some states have only 1 professional per 1,000 people.
